ARTICLE I - ESTABLISHMENT OF RELIGIOUS ASSEMBLY TRUST

This Irrevocable Foreign Situs Religious Assembly Trust (hereinafter "Trust" of "Assembly") is created under the principles of common law, natural law, international law, and religious freedom doctrines, ensuring its lawful autonomy as a non-statutory, tax-exempt, faith-based entity pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 508(c)(1)(a).

This Trust shall function as a **private ecclesiastical entity**, governed by the spiritual laws, customs, and practices of its *Members as Beneficiaries and Trustees*.

Current Beneficiaries and Member(s) are as followed:

- Sovereign State of Ayita Nation

ARTICLE II - DECLARATION OF FOREIGN SITUS

This Religious Assembly is established as a **Foreign Situs Trust**, operating **outside domestic statutory jurisdiction**, and under the following protections:

- Natural Law & Ecclesiastical Law The Assembly recognizes givine authority above man-made statutory laws.
- **Common Law Jurisdiction** The Trust is protected under **contract law**, free from regulatory overreach.
- International Recognition The Trust operates under international religious freedom protections, including the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR, 1948).

This foreign situs ensures that:

- 1. The Assembly is immune from statutory interference and governmental overreach.
- 2. All affairs remain confidential and outside public record.
- 3. It retains sovereign jurisdiction over its Members and assets.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE & MISSION

This Trust is established to:

- 1. Advance spiritual teachings and religious education for its Members.
- 2. **Provide private and lawful protections for faith-based practices**, free from government oversight.
- 3. **Preserve divine rights and religious sovereignty** under Magna Carta (1215), English Bill of Rights (1689), and constitutional law.
- 4. Operate as a self-governed ecclesiastical assembly, with no external legal interference.
- 5. Promote human rights and religious freedoms under international law.

This Assembly shall **not be subject to statutory regulation**, and shall maintain exclusive control over all affairs, including doctrine, property, and governance.

ARTICLE IV - IRREVOCABILITY & NON-STATUTORY STATUS

- This Religious Trust is irrevocable and may not be modified or revoked by any outside authority.
- The Assembly is a non-statutory, private religious entity, free from state incorporation or registration.
- 3. **No legislative act, court order, or government agency** shall have jurisdiction over the Assembly's religious affairs.
- All assets are held in trust for the benefit of Members, safeguarded from state intervention or taxation.

ARTICLE V -- PROTECTIONS UNDER COMMON LAW & INTERNATIONAL LAW

This Assembly asserts its legal and spiritual protections under:

5.1 Magna Carta (1215)

- Clause 1: "The English Church shall be free, and shall have its rights undiminished, and its liberties unimpaired."
- Clause 39: No free person shall be seized, imprisoned, dispossessed, or exiled except by lawful judgment of their peers.

5.2 English Bill of Rights (1689)

- Right to Religious Freedom: Government shall not interfere in private religious practice.
- Right to Property: No entity shall confiscate or control religious assets without consent.

5.3 U.S. Constitutional Protections

- First Amendment: Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof.
- Fourth Amendment: Protection from unlawful searches and seizures of religious property.
- **Fifth Amendment:** No private property shall be taken for public use without just compensation.
- **Ninth Amendment:** Rights not enumerated in the Constitution remain retained by the people.
- **Tenth Amendment:** Powers not delegated to the federal government remain with the people.

5.4 United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR, 1948)

- Article 18: Everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience, and religion.
- Article 20: Everyone has the right to freedom of peaceful assembly and association.
- Article 30: No government may take actions that suppress these fundamental freedoms.

These protections establish the religious sovereignty and legal immunity of this Assembly.

ARTICLE VI – STRUCTURE & GOVERNANCE

6.1 Trusteeship

The following individuals shall serve as Trustees, ensuring adherence to the principles of the Trust:

Primary Trustee(s):

- Jasmine LaChe Hughes (JASMINE AYITA LaChe), Presiding Trustee
- Sovereign State of Ayita Nation, Co-Trustee

The Trustees shall:

- 1. Oversee all religious and administrative affairs of the Assembly.
- 2. Protect the Trust's assets from external interference.

3. Manage all records privately, with no obligation of public disclosure.

6.2 Assembly Members

Membership is by invitation only and subject to the following criteria:

- Must uphold the spiritual and religious tenets of the Assembly.
- Must acknowledge the Trust's sovereign status.
- Must respect the private nature of Assembly affairs.

6.3 Religious Services & Functions

- The Assembly may conduct religious services, ceremonies, and educational programs.
- It may provide sanctuary, spiritual counseling, and lawful protections for its Members.
- No external authority shall have jurisdiction over religious doctrine or practice.

ARTICLE VII - TRUST PROPERTY & ASSETS

All property held in this Trust is designated as **sacred and inalienable**, managed for the benefit of Members. The Trust shall:

- 1. Maintain full legal ownership of all land, buildings, and assets.
- 2. Exercise exclusive control over its use and distribution.
- 3. Protect assets from taxation, seizure, or external claims.

ARTICLE VIII - TAX-EXEMPT STATUS (508(c)(1)(a))

This Trust qualifies as a 508(c)(1)(a) tax-exempt religious organization, meaning:

- It is not required to file tax returns with the IRS.
- It enjoys automatic First Amendment tax-exemption without government approval.
- It operates as a non-reporting, non-incorporated entity free from IRS jurisdiction.

All donations, contributions, and assets received are **not taxable** and shall be used solely for religious and Assembly purposes.

ARTICLE IX - DISPUTE RESOLUTION & JURISDICTION

- Internal Resolution: Any disputes shall be resolved internally by the Trustees.
- Common Law Venue: All matters shall be settled under private arbitration, not statutory courts.

3. **Foreign Jurisdiction:** The situs of this Trust is established in **[Foreign Jurisdiction]**, ensuring absolute autonomy.

ARTICLE X - FINAL PROVISIONS

- 1. Confidentiality: All Assembly matters are private and protected under spiritual law.
- 2. **Indemnification:** The Trustees and Members are indemnified against external claims or liabilities.
- 3. **Perpetuity Clause:** This Trust shall continue indefinitely unless unanimously dissolved by the Trustees.

PREAMBLE

This Trust Agreement is established on this April 1, 2025, by and between the Settlor(s) and the Trustee(s), for the benefit of the Private Members of the Sovereign State of Ayita Nation trust (hereinafter the Trust). The Trust operates as a Private Membership Association (PMA) under the inherent and

inalienable rights protected by the Magna Carta (1215), the English Bill of Rights (1689), and constitutional protections under Natural Law and Common Law principles.

ARTICLE I - DECLARATION OF TRUST

- 1.1 Trust Formation This Trust is an Irrevocable, Foreign Situs, Common Law Trust, existing in its own jurisdiction, outside statutory regulations, and governed by private contract law.
- 1.2 Purpose of the Trust The purpose of the Trust is to protect and govern private assets, enforce the rights and freedoms of its Members, and provide for the preservation and administration of Trust property.
- 1.3 Governing Laws The Trust is established under the principles of Common Law, the Magna Carta (1215), the English Bill of Rights (1689), and international customary law protecting private associations and sovereign governance.

ARTICLE II - TRUST STRUCTURE

- 2.1 Settlor(s) The Settlor(s) voluntarily conveys property into the Trust for the exclusive benefit of the Members.
- 2.2 Trustee(s) The Trustee(s) shall manage, protect, and administer the Trust Estate in accordance with the Trust Indenture and the will of the Private Membership.
- 2.3 Beneficiaries The Beneficiaries are the Private Members of the Trust, whose participation is governed by the Private Membership Agreement.
- 2.4 Private Membership Association (PMA) Membership is by private invitation only and requires agreement to abide by the Trust's rules and bylaws.

ARTICLE III - RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS

- 3.1 Recognition of Sovereign Rights This Trust acknowledges and upholds the unalienable rights of its Members, which predate and supersede statutory government control, including:
- Freedom of Association (Article 20, Universal Declaration of Human Rights)
- Right to Private Contract (Article 1, Section 10, U.S. Constitution)
- Right to Private Property (Magna Carta, Clause 29)
- Due Process and Equal Protection (Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments, U.S. Constitution)
- 3.2 Common Law Protections This Trust operates exclusively under the Common Law, rejecting statutory jurisdiction, corporate governance, and foreign interference.
- 3.3 Exemption from Public Law As a Foreign Situs Trust, this entity does not fall under statutory jurisdiction but rather is protected under international law and the principles of private contract.

ARTICLE IV - TRUST PROPERTY

- 4.1 Trust Estate All assets conveyed into the Trust shall be held in the name of the Trust and managed for the benefit of its Members.
- 4.2 Prohibition Against Alienation The assets of the Trust are not subject to seizure, taxation, or regulatory control by any outside authority.
- 4.3 Irrevocability This Trust is permanent and irrevocable; no Settlor, Trustee, or Beneficiary may revoke or dissolve the Trust.

ARTICLE V - ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT

- 5.1 Duties of the Trustees The Trustees shall:
- Uphold the governing principles of the Trust.
- Maintain records of all transactions and agreements.
- Protect and manage Trust assets.
- Enforce the rights of Members.
- 5.2 Membership Governance Decisions shall be made by a Council of Trustees or through direct votes of the Private Members in accordance with the Trust Bylaws.
- 5.3 Dispute Resolution All disputes shall be resolved through Private Arbitration in accordance with Common Law principles.

ARTICLE VI - SUCCESSION AND AMENDMENTS

6.1 Successor Trustees The Trust shall appoint Successor Trustees to ensure continuity.
6.2 Amendments This Trust may only be amended by unanimous agreement of the Trustees, ensuring alignment with its original purpose.

ARTICLE VII - FINAL PROVISIONS

- 7.1 Non-Recognition by Statutory Courts This Trust does not recognize statutory courts and operates independently under its own jurisdiction.
- 7.2 Indemnification All Trustees, Members, and Successors shall be indemnified against external claims, provided their actions are in accordance with the Trust's principles.
- 7.3 Confidentiality and Non-Disclosure All Trust affairs shall remain private and confidential. Any unauthorized disclosure constitutes a breach of the Trust Agreement.
